GLENAEON RECEIVES BER GRANT

We are very happy to inform you that Glenaeon has been awarded a \$2 million grant by the Federal Government for new facilities at the Castlecrag Campus. This is part of the Rudd Governments 'Building the Education Revolution' stimulus package for Schools. This money will be spent on new buildings and building upgrades at the Castlecrag Campus including a new hall building for eurythmy, plays, meetings and community events and replacement of the portable classroom with new learning areas. The timeline is quite tight – the project is to be completed by December 2010 so you can expect to see some plans very soon and building works not long afterwards!

A preliminary presentation of the schematic design will be made at the P&F General Meeting on Monday 18th May for all who can attend. I will also present the proposal at the rescheduled Castlecrag Forum on 25th May. I would like to acknowledge the invaluable assistance of David Jacobson (School Architect) and Malcolm Day (School Council) who worked very hard to help me put the application together.

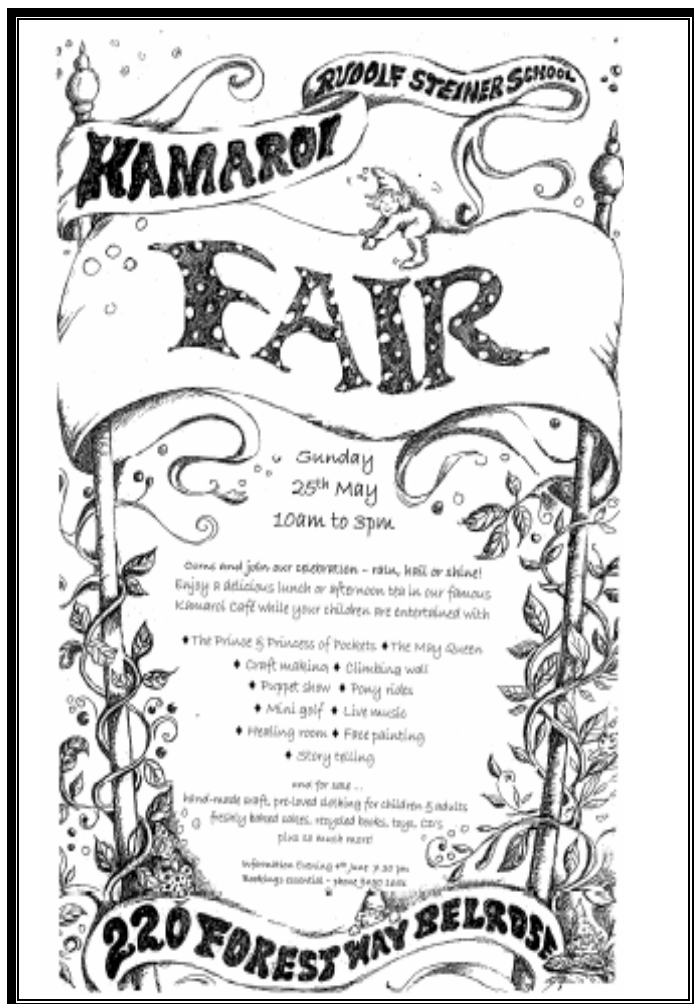
