

Applied Maths in Action

Class 10 has just returned from 2 weeks out in the field applying trigonometry and triangulation to the practical needs of surveying. The class made a survey of aboriginal rock carvings at West Head and will prepare a detailed site plan and elevation for the Aboriginal Heritage Office as a result of their work.



In these days of GPS, how important it is for young people to know the underlying principles of map making. Dr Steiner often commented on how we become slaves to technology when we use it without understanding its working principles. We just live on the surfaces of things when we push buttons without any idea of the mathematical or mechanical process operating beneath our fingers. So the students worked with theodolites to make precise measurements, then used trigonometry to calculate the detail of the maps they then drew. A good example of learning by doing real things: Applied Maths in action.

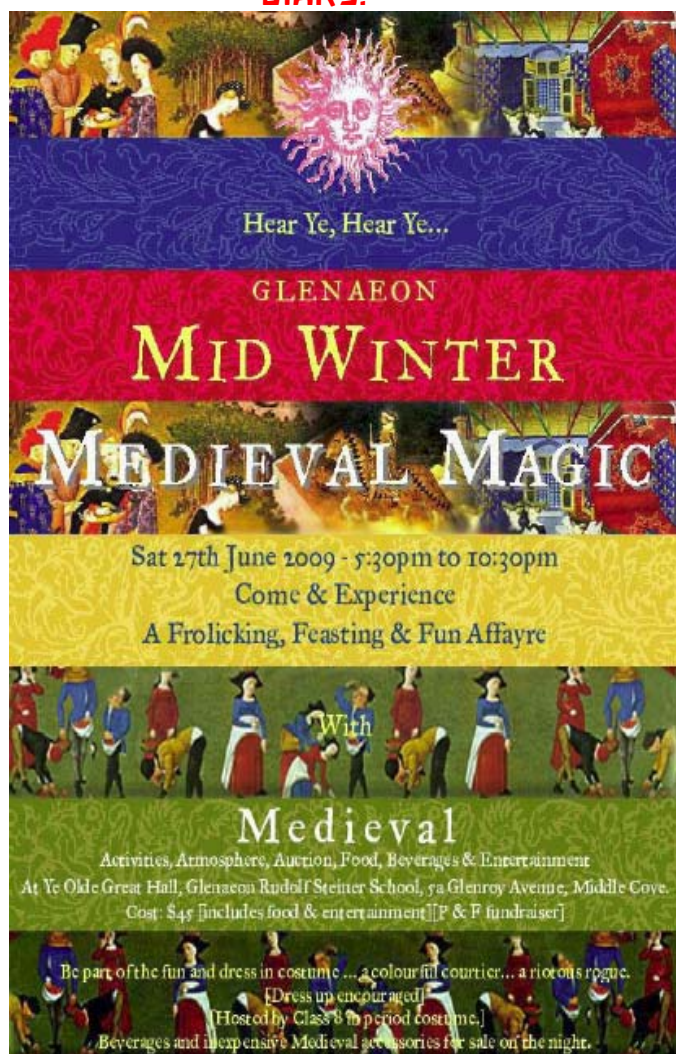

DON'T LET THOSE AUTUMN LEAVES GO TO WASTE!

If you have a deciduous tree then please bring bags of leaves down to Glenaeon's gardens for our next BD compost heap. They will provide a valuable proportion of the carbonaceous material needed for healthy compost (80% carbon, 20% nitrogen). Autumn leaves make particularly beautiful compost. We can use limitless quantities! Please do not include any eucalypt leaves.

If you have access to cow, horse or chicken manure, please collect and bring to the gardens. Grass clippings are also needed.

If you live in an apartment and cannot recycle your food scraps, buy a bucket with a lid and make regular contributions to our newly established worm farm or compost bin. The black bin next to the compost heaps (far NE end of the garden) is a temporary holding bin for food scraps. The worm farm is behind the shade house. For the worm farm, please cut up your scraps and do not include citrus or onion/garlic. If you're not sure where to put it, deliver to Class IV room.

The Class IV garden has now been replanted, thanks to the new fence built by Nelson. Wildlife destroyed the first crop over the Easter break, so if you are visiting the garden, please remember to shut the gates!

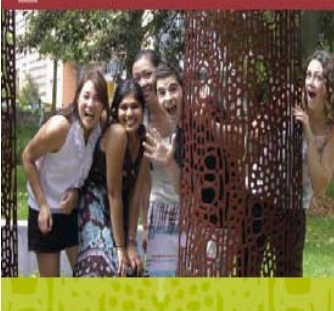
